Other Matters:

1. Witness Interviews: Because it is important to the Family to proceed with this Inquest without further delay, the Family has agreed to waive interviews for the subject-matter witnesses for the following topics: Taser Training and Policy, General Training and Policy, Crisis Intervention Team Training and Policy, Crime Scene Investigation and Force Investigation Team. The Administrator (through the Inquest Program Attorney) reserves the right to interview any of the witnesses and will provide prior notice to the parties if he intends to do so.

2. Use of Depositions:

- a. The Family has agreed to waive designating prior depositions as substantive evidence and will only request to use them for impeachment purposes.
- b. The parties have agreed that witnesses Davisson, Grinstead and Outlaw, will review applicable depositions previously taken in a civil matter regarding the subject matter of their respective testimony and will provide a statement indicating that they have reviewed the depositions and identify any statements and opinions expressed in those depositions that they do not agree with.
